Students who aren't making sufficient progress towards graduation will have a conference and be assigned after school tutorial. We will have quarterly academic assemblies to acknowledge and encourage students. Teachers will meet weekly to discuss student goals and Action # 2 intervene when students are not progressing. Students will be offered the opportunity to take coursework at home through our laptop loaner program. Accelerated students will be referred to the Advance to College coordinator by the counselor to determine eligibility for the program and early enrollment at College.

Students will be referred to the site developer for an aptitude assessment utilizing Career Cruising. They will also be referred to the workforce connection liaison for eligibility assessment for possible internships and employment upon graduation.  Students will be given Community Service packets for Elective credit and to encourage building work experience for their resumes.

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#### E.1. Assurances

The School Site Council (SSC) develops and revises the Single Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA) and the corresponding budget to be presented for approval to the Board of Education of the Fresno Unified School District annually.

The SSC, and all advisory committees, are formed in accordance with procedures established by federal or state law and regulations, and with membership parity as mandated. The advisory committees provide input on the SPSA.

The principal is an active member of the SSC and participates in regularly scheduled meetings throughout the school year. Classroom teachers, school staff, parents and students (secondary level only) are also participating members.

The school's SSC, staff and parents participate in a needs assessment to help guide SPSA development.

The members of the SSC, the school's English Learners' Advisory Committee (ELAC) and members of other advisory school committees received information and data detailing the needs of students during the SPSA development process and the comprehensive needs assessment. Information for all significant subgroups includes the educationally disadvantaged students, students with disabilities, gifted and talented students, English Learners, and migrant students.

School sites schedule SSC and ELAC meetings yearly to elect officers, designate representation for district meetings (DAC and DELAC), and provide input for the SPSA. ELAC may vote to consolidate with the SSC every two years.

Opportunities for parents to participate in the development of the SPSA are provided by all schools, as described in the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (federal law), California Education Code, and the policies and regulations of the Fresno Unified School District Board of Education. The SPSA includes strategies to improve parent involvement and examples of the Parent Involvement Policy and the Parent-School Compact.

Strategies to improve students' achievement, meet measurable objectives, provide high quality professional development, and support struggling students use scientifically-based research. The reforms provide opportunities for all students to meet State Standards by implementing the Common Core, extending learning time, and supporting grade-level and school-level student transitions.

The Single Plan for Student Achievement is reviewed and revised during the first semester of each school year, and reevaluated and re-written during the second semester for annual approval by the Board of Education.
